The Guild's next meeting is on March 8th at 7:00 PM in the Wood Shop Classroom at East Kentwood High School. Jim Wellever, Dept. Head of the Michigan Career and Technical Institute (MCTI), is going to talk about MCTI's Cabinetmaking/Millwork Training Program, located east of Plainwell, MI. Right here in West Michigan!

MCTI is operated by the State of Michigan, it is not a 'for-profit' training center. The Cabinetmaking/Millwork program is in the Midwest Advanced Woodworking Technology Center at the MCTI, one of the most technically advanced woodworking training centers in all of the United States! Along with gender neutral 'Hands On' commercial woodworking training, the Institute also offers 12 other career certificate programs.

MCTI can also assist students with meeting High School Graduation and GED requirements, tuition fees, on-site lodging and job placement after they complete their career training program.
