Biscuit Joiner Demonstration May 10th Meeting

Doug Scott will be showing
Guild Members at the May 10th
Guild meeting how to use a
Biscuit Joiner to create a strong
and sturdy box joins and how to
use Biscuit joinery to reinforce
picture frames corners.

Biscuit Joinery can be used in
a number of ways. Using wood
Biscuits is an inexpensive and
quick way to join any type of
panel glue up.

Biscuits will add strength and
alignment whenever joining
multiple boards to create table
tops or other wide wood pan-
els. They are an excellent way
to reinforce drawer corners so
they can with stand the rigors of
everyday use. The use of Bis-
cuit joinery is really only limited
by your creativity and imagina-
tion.

Doug's presentation should
prove to be very interesting and
helpful to those Guild members
who have not considered using
Biscuit Joinery in their wood-
working projects.

“Master Woodworker”

Every serious Woodworker wants to improve their woodworking skills. The big question to these folks is, ‘How can I speed the process of becoming a Master Woodworker?’

Do I need to invest in more and better tools? Is it done by seeing live demonstrations? Can I do it by reading woodworking articles and watching on-line woodworking videos?
