Michigan Career & Technology Institute Cabinetmaking & Millwork Program

Michigan Career and Technological Institute (MCTI) is home to the Midwest Advanced Woodworking Technology Center. MCTI's program provides industrial woodworking training in Michigan and is considered one of the most technically advanced in the nation. The program was also the first site in Michigan certifying Woodworking National Skill Standards. The program was honored with the coveted "Educator of the Year" award in from the WMIA (Woodworking Machinery Industry Association).

Michigan has one of the largest woodworking economies in the country. Over 6% of all manufacturing jobs in Michigan are woodworking-related. As technology has advanced, the demand for highly qualified workers is increasing in demand.

Workers with woodworking skills have abundant employment opportunities in west Michigan. The US Department of Labor projects excellent opportunities for highly skilled woodworkers, especially those with technical skills and CNC knowledge. Industry estimates show that seventy percent of the current workforce is over 50 years old and as these workers retire, the industry will need new highly skilled workers. The trade is gender neutral with an estimated 60% of the workforce being women. The vast majority of the females graduating from the program having excellent careers in the trade.

The program offers certificate options, and marketability. Cabinetmaking/Millwork students receive extensive training in CAD/CAM and CNC operation. Skills that are in higher demand every day!

This includes all types of cabinets, paints, electrical & plumbing supplies, tools, nails, lumber, counter tops, work surfaces, carpeting, shelving, etc. You name it and you may find it at a ReStore Outlet at a great savings!

It is not a standard store. They may have what you want one day and not the next. Because they depend on donations they stock what they get, when they get it. You have buy what you want or need when you see it at ReStore. It is a 'First Come', 'First Serve,' type of store with no reordering.

For these reasons you have to stop by regularly just to see if they have those special building supply items you have been looking!
