

How is your shop protected from FIRE? Think about it, lots of woodchips, sawdust and the addition of flammable liquids and you have the makin's of a Smokin' Hot Time!

Let's start with the obvious, do you have a working Smoke Detector? When did you last check the battery? How about a readily available working Fire Extinguisher? A metal covered trash can? All these checks are to fix the problem that in almost all cases can be prevented.

A good start is housekeeping, like sweeping the floor. It really doesn't take that much to walk out of a freshly swept shop, EVERY DAY you leave it. Dust collection can make this job less difficult. A quick shot with compressed air can clean out power tools in a hurry.

How about applying finishes, those ones with VOC's attached? In an enclosed space (like a woodshop) the VOC's are generally highly combustible. Good ventilation is HIGHLY desirable. This applies to hand applied and sprayed finishes, more so the sprayed finish. Those pesky rags you used to apply or clean up the finish should be placed in the Cover Metal Trash Can.

Clean UP Your Act and your shop.

## January show and tell



In the 17th century book, "The Art of Joinery" by Joseph Moxon, he detailed out a double screw vise using wood threads and wooden screws. The vise was designed to hold the ends of boards stable for things such as dovetailing. The quality of the design has held up for hundreds of years as today these vises are just as useful as they were back then.



Dave Postmus brought in the Moxon vise he has built from ash wood. The back flange allows this vise to be clamped almost anywhere, and the double threaded rods with spinner wings allow secure clamping. Dave has done a nice job on this.





# January presentation recap


Deciphering whether plans you might want to use or buy are good quality plans can be difficult : especially when they have pretty pictures. Many things that look like high quality plans may be unbuildable.



This may be a quality drawing, but without breaking the process down into manageable steps the drawing is useless.

But if every step is broken down piece-by-piece and step-by-step instructions given for those pieces, even a very complex project is buildable.

This looks like a great chair, but the instructions and drawings are so poor it is unbuildable without a lot of redrawing first.



Key points to remember when evaluating plans :

Can you tell what you are supposed to do and how to do it just based on the pictures? The images should tell the story before you even read any words.

Do the plans contain process instructions? Plans that throw lots of part drawings at you but give you no indication of how to assemble those parts are like throwing someone a box of LEGOs and a picture of what to build. Without process instructions, many plans are useless.


If your work requires knowing a wood's precise moisture content, moisture meters are very useful.



Depth gauges come in many forms and can be used to set saw heights, measure hole depths, part heights, or even step heights on projects.



The January Cool Tools segment was all about digital measuring. The world of precision has come a long way since the advent of digital technology, and now even the home shop can achieve levels of accuracy only dreamed of just a few decades ago.



If you could only own one precision measuring tool, the digital caliper would be king. Most calipers these days can be set to Imperial or Metric, and can measure inner, outer, and depths.



Saw angle gauge. Enough said.

You would have to be building something pretty big to need a laser range finder, but hey, wood working projects come in all shapes and sizes.
