




Tak Board. Each square is 2" including the thin strip between them. The center is cherry, next is maple, then cherry again. The outer frame and the thin strips are sipo. There are 60 game pieces plus the two king pieces. The small inserted pieces are also sipo. The pockets for these pieces were cut on my CNC machine. It was all finished with Tung oil.




