

Although I know Jim makes these for fall craft fairs, I think it would be rather interesting if next meeting Jim brought in something that he had knitted.





Dale Smith carved this mirror frame out of Basswood. I have never done any carving, but this looks great to me!



I didn't catch the name of the person that made this small-scale replica of a Gerstner machinists tool box. Although they only brought in some pictures to project onto the screen, it is clear that this is such a fine piece of work.

Tom Howorth brought in this custom cutting board that he had made. The main portion of the board is made from maple, while the fish is made from sapele and purple-heart. This is a good example of the kind of work that can be done using an angled blade/table on a scroll saw.





The first think I thought of when I saw these pieces brought in by Noel Cormier was “Cricket Bat”. But no, these are mash paddles used to stir mash when making home-brew beer.

Noel makes these using a CNC router out of maple. There is no finish on these intentionally.
