Bring your Show and Tell piece and show us what you do. We are still putting the finishing touches on our Guild Incorporation and Insurance plan.




While you're at it, how about any Safety Aids you think the rest of us could use, Like Push Sticks Nifty Feather boards etc.




In memory of Steve Babcock


In 2019, Steve got into a wood top competition with Jim Jakosh.



Choosing a drill press - my dilemma

Continuing my saga on choosing tools, a new drill press is in my future, and man, have I looked at a lot of them! My current drill press works fine, but it is small really not up to the work I want it to do. A new drill press needs to solve these issues :

- Table flex : This is a huge issue with me. With larger bits or very hard wood, either the table or the column is flexing slightly, mis-aligning my holes. I want precision. So many drill presses on the market have flimsy looking table clamps.
- Stroke length : I have managed so far, but I have often wanted more quill travel.
- Power : My drill press stalls with larger bits or the chuck slips under larger loads. A bench-top drill press should be able to handle a 2" Forstner bit or a hole saw through hardwood.
- Speed changes : The easier the better. I drill many things at the wrong speed due to the difficulty in changing the belts.



- Heavy duty table clamp


- Very expensive


