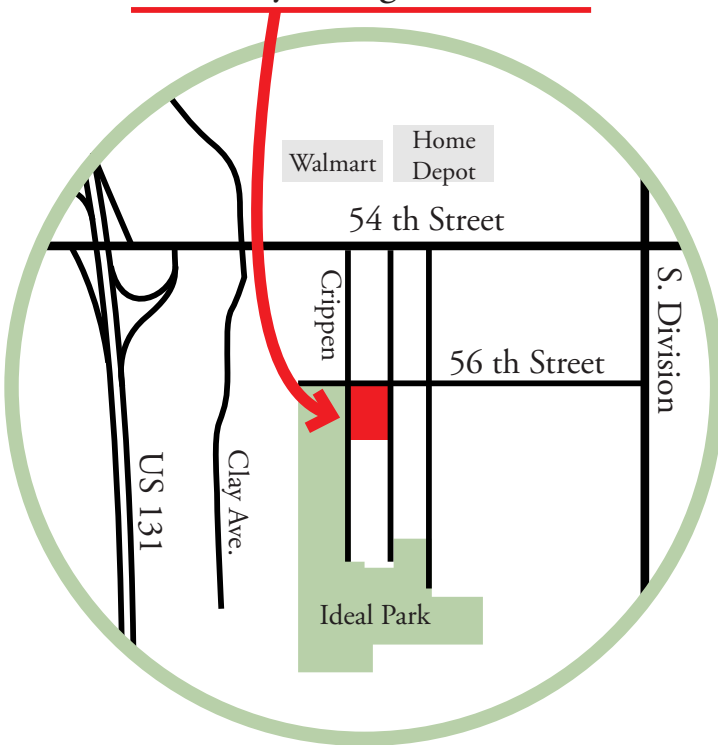
President's Message

CNC carved U.S. Flag by Dennis Beard.

To make this flag first Dennis cut the waves into a flat board. Second was painting, and then finally cut additional grooves to offset the red and white stripes. The Army logo was then done with a laser. Nice job.



Purple Heart Box, by Dennis Beard.

Dennis made this with his CNC and then used a laser to engrave the butterfly. Well done.



Butterfly bowls, by Steve Payne.
These bowls are made from bamboo and walnut, then finished with lacquer and wipe on polyurethane (at least I think that was what he said).
I don't remember if the butterfly patterns were made with a CNC or a laser, but either way, they turned out very nice.

According to Doug, the drawers came from a dumpster dive then he built the case to go around them by using tenons.

I think this is pretty slick, and I like the upcycling.

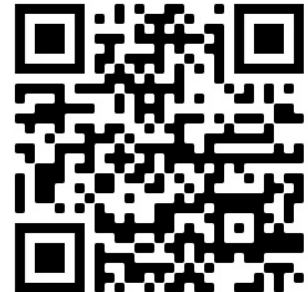

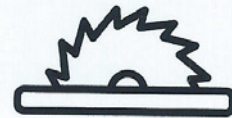
