

Breathing

When you look carefully near the ceiling of your shop do you notice any fine dust? If you don't, I'm guessing your shop isn't used much. Saws, routers, and sanders are the greatest generators of dust. But, just about any power tool, as well as hand sanders, creates fine

particles that I'm calling "dust." Your woodworking creates it. It hangs in the air within your shop, air that you breathe. What may dust do to you?

COPD - Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease is an umbrella term used to describe progressive lung diseases, including emphysema, chronic bronchitis, and refractory (non-reversible) asthma. COPD is characterized by increasing breathlessness – a condition often associated with coal miners. **News Flash!** woodworkers get it too! Dust settles in your lungs. Breathing problems begin – and get worse over time.

Protect yourself -- use a good quality mask when cutting and sanding, particularly on exotic woods and on wood products that contain resins, like MDF. Keep the mask on for a good while as you move on to other woodworking tasks. Also, just about any kind of spraying throws stuff into the air, stuff that shouldn't be in anyone's lungs.

PROTECT YOURSELF. Find a mask. Try it on. You want one that **you will wear**. If the mask is uncomfortable, bulky, or difficult to put on and take off, you probably won't use it. Find one you can live with **and use it**. Store it at a convenient and visible place in your shop. Replace it (or the filter) as specified by the manufacturer. Remember, you don't want to die wondering where your next breath is coming from.
